

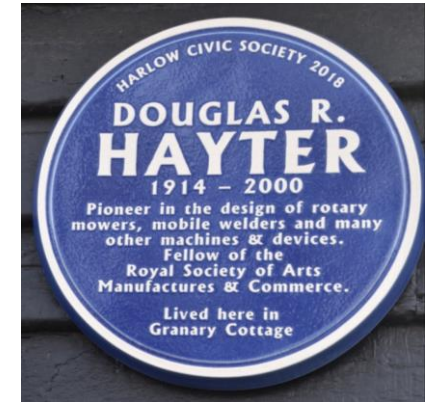
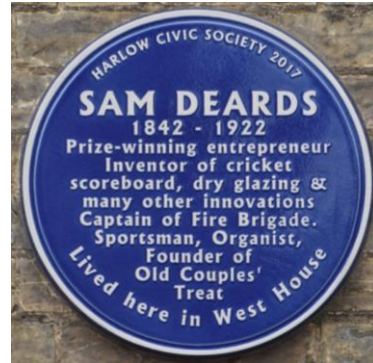


Take part in Harlow Museum's competition to design a Blue Plaque

Here shows that the plaque has been placed in the Town Park.

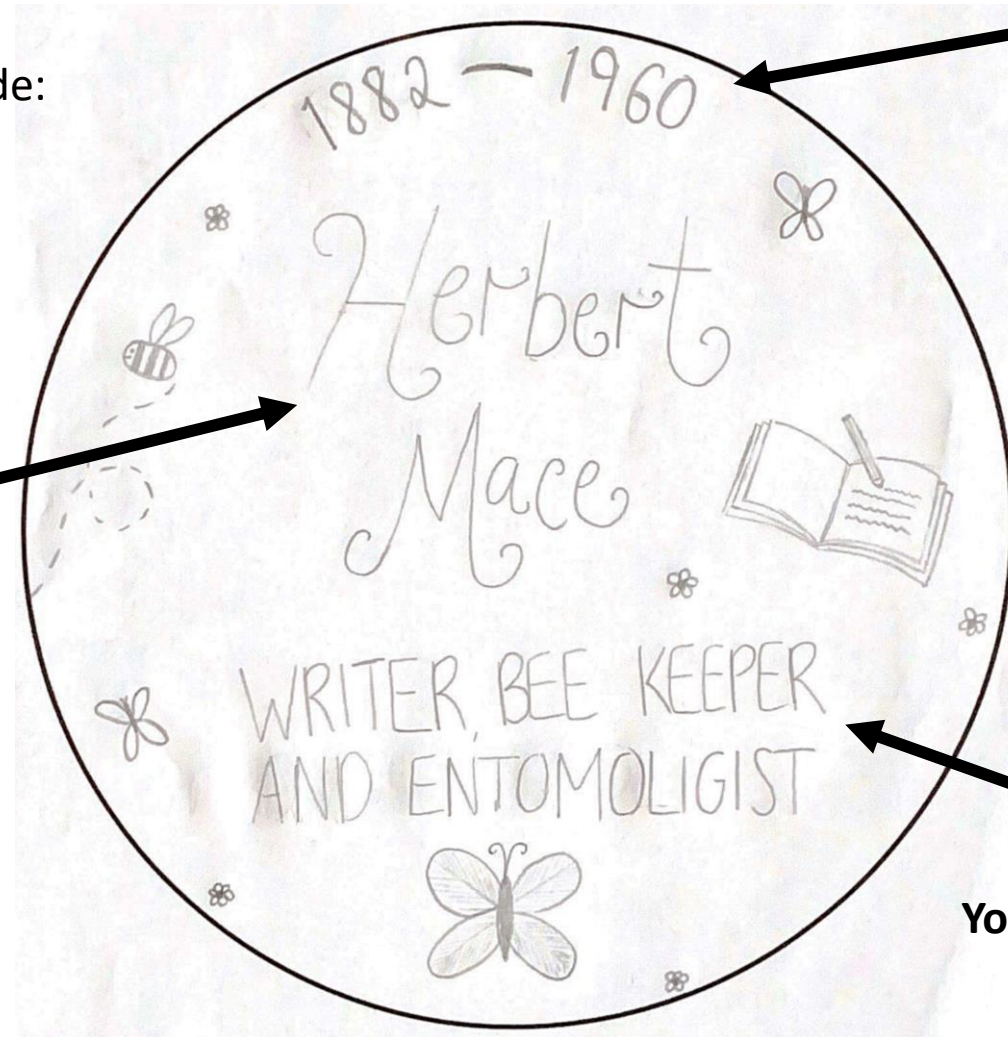

The competition will run from 9th March until 18th April.

For ages 4 – 14.

Three judges will pick a winner and honourable mentions on 20th April. The judges will be one member from Harlow Museum staff, one from Harlow Civic society and a Youth councillor.

There will be an Awards Ceremony on the 4th of May where you will be able to see the plaque entries displayed. The winner will receive a blue plaque, featuring their own design, to take home.
